Building Update

The soft ground breaking was held on Friday, November 21st at 2 p.m. Bob Powers has graciously volunteered to manage the project for the Task Force. He will be very busy spending his days at the work site once the project begins. The new building boasts a great new floor plan and separate private offices for the interviewing of clients. The bids came back in a little higher than expected since construction costs are going up. We will be using White Construction of Castle Rock and they will try to hire local sub contractors—keeping jobs in Parker. The new building will cost approximately \$1,433,500. This figure does not include the new coolers, freezer, shelving, etc... We will continue our Capital Campaign to raise money to pay for the building. The board of directors approved getting a loan to help fund the building until we have raised enough funds. We are expecting the building to be completed by the end of next summer. Recap of the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner

A huge thank you to Terry Kania for hosting the volunteer dinner. It was a beautiful evening that began with Steve Budnack recognizing Nancy Gripman as the founder and longest serving volunteer of the Parker Task Force. He also gave a financial, general and building update. It included:

- Senior population needing help has increased.
- Largest increase is those outside of Parker needing help. Increase of 29%.
- 3 months of food on hand.
- At the end of August, PTF had 719K in the capital campaign.
- Reserves- about 11 months on hand.

What do our volunteers do?

Ted goes to the schools every week to deliver backpacks with food for students who are deemed homeless by the school district. Over 283 backpacks are delivered each month. Eight schools in the Parker area participate in this program. Ted you are making a difference in so many lives. Thank you!

Jill is our grant writer and has written more grants than ever for PTF for both the operating and capital campaign. We are already starting to see the benefits of this. We could not do this without her. Thank you!

Sue K. is working to incorporate many of the ideas from our volunteers to update the Volunteer Personnel Policy. Thank you!


